



MSc in Environmental Economics

Full and part-time study at The University of Manchester



The MSc in Environmental Economics at The University of Manchester is a one-year programme that offers high level training and skills in economics and quantitative analysis. The programme provides students with an opportunity to study core economic methods and theory with relevant applications to the environment.

You will learn about:

- econometric analysis and microeconomic theory
- natural resource economics
- the economics of environmental policy
- how economists value environmental impacts



In addition you will engage with environmental economics research in practice through regular seminars and interaction with academic staff, and by writing a dissertation.

Some of our recent graduates work with international organisations including the World Bank and the United Nations as well as with regulatory agencies and commercial consultancies. A number of our graduates are also pursuing PhD degrees in Environmental and Resource Economics at universities in UK and US.
